Principal's Message

The beautiful sunny summer-like weather seems to be making more regular appearances. Being able to shed the winter gear is such a welcome change. As we pull out the summer gear, it may be helpful to review some old and new clothing guidelines. Before going further in this discussion, I want to communicate two foundational ideals.

- 1) Clothing choices are personal—and we recognize that any time guidelines are suggested, the possibility of offense is present. That is very concerning to us, and we want to be careful to avoid offense. When a school is presenting guidelines, we are not making a judgement about a person's character or taste. We are seeking to create an environment that is conducive to learning.
- 2) Clothing appropriateness is often determined by the learning situation. This is why we are cautious about creating a list of hard and fast rules for students and staff.

As a school, our number one goal is student learning and we work every day to create an environment that supports that. So here are some guidelines we would ask be considered...

- -Select clothing that is appropriate for a school setting. Students should not be limited from participating in learning activities by clothing, nor should clothing create embarrassing or distracting situations for students. So we ask that...
 - Chests and stomachs are covered
 - Shorts and skirts are mid-thigh or longer
 - Undergarments are not showing
 - Clothing with messages that may offend be avoided
 - Straps on all students' shirts be at least three fingers wide

What we are seeking to do is create general guidelines that, when followed, will help avoid situations where staff will have to make clothing judgements. Please note, these guidelines apply to all students in every grade.

HOW STUDENTS ARE PLACED INTO CLASSES @ KLEEFELD SCHOOL

As we are heading into the final six weeks of classes, preparations for the 2016-17 school year have also begun. Sometimes parents wonder how class lists are created. Here are the criteria we consider and the process we use.

- 1) Homeroom teachers ask each of their students to identify at least three friends they would like to be with in class. Teachers try to ensure that a student has at least one of those friend requests in his/her class.
- 2) Academic and Behaviour Considerations—We try to balance classes.

3) Parent Requests—From time to time parents will make requests for the placement of their students. These _____ are considered by teachers.



Teachers create introductory class lists. Then the sending teachers, receiving teachers, resource teachers and principals meet to review the introductory lists. Changes are made and tentative class lists are created. Due to unexpected circumstances such as a sudden influx of students at one particular age group, class lists are always subject to change. When late changes do occur, parents will be notified by the principal. As always, we are open to your questions and feed back. MIDDLE SCHOOL INFO FOR 2016-17

Grade 7/8 Band

All students in grades 7 and 8 are expected to be a part of our band program. There are no other class options offered at the same time as band class.
