

SENSITIVE ISSUES FOR GR. 5 AND 7 STUDENTS

Each year, as part of the Health Ed. curriculum, Gr. 5 and Gr. 7 students are taught family life education called Sensitive Isues. GR. 7 /8 FINAL ASSESSMENTS ARE NO MORE!

Past practice at Kleefeld School has been to have students in Gr. 7-9 participate in year end assessments. There are several reasons for moving away from this practice. First, these assessments take a lot of class time that could be used for teaching. Second, students are given final assessments in all of their core classes which results in four or five major assignments occurring at the same time. This is overwhelming for students. Third, if assessment has been occurring as it should in regular classes, final assessment projects are not necessary. Fourth, we have a new provincial report card which has no place to report final assessment results.
