



The season that head lice become active and mobile is here. The most important thing for parents to hear is that if/when your child has head lice, it is in no way a personal


reflection on them or their family. They are just very mobile little creatures.

The <u>most important</u> way to get rid of head lice is to ensure that <u>all nits and eggs</u> are removed from <u>every strand</u> of hair on the person's head. There are special combs for this.
