Online Registration for Kindergarten

Kindergarten registration for the 2020-21 school year will open on January 6, 2020. To be eligible, HANOVER children must be five years of age on or before December 31, 2020. The registration process will take place online at <u>www.HSD.ca</u>. If you do not have access to the Internet, please visit the school office and

we can assist you in completing the registration on a school computer. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to register their children soon after registration opens in January. Early registration will assist us in preparation and planning for the upcoming school year. Registering before March 1, 2020, will ensure there is sufficient time for school appointments and provide parents/quardians with the opportunity to participate in Kindergarten orientation activities. Cold Weather Considerations

Please be aware that Kleefeld School students are expected to participate in outdoor recess and should dress appropriately for the weather conditions. When temperatures/wind chills are between -25 & -29, recess is still outside but is shortened. When temperatures/wind chills are at/beyond -30, recess is indoors. Weather Related School Closure quidelines are available on the HSD website. HSD will close for extreme

hazardous conditions (blizzards, blowing snow) and for cold weather reasons when the temperature at the Environment Canada weather station in Kleefeld at 6:00 AM is at minus 35 degrees Celsius or colder <u>OR</u> is experiencing a wind chill of minus 45 degrees Celsius or colder. If concerned about child safety during periods of extreme weather, parents may choose to keep their children at home.
